THE GLOBAL STATE OF DEMOCRACY 2019

The Global State of Democracy 2019: Addressing the Ills, Reviving the Promise is the second edition of the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance's (International IDEA) flagship report. The main global launch takes place in Brussels on 19 November 2019.

The Report provides a health check of the state of the world's democracy, analysing trends, opportunities and challenges that are seen across various regions and within regions. The analysis is based on The Global State of Democracy (GSoD) Indices, an index produced by International IDEA that measures democratic performance across 158 countries from 1975 to today.

The Report aims to inform the global democracy debate with evidence and data and to provide a nuanced analysis of how opportunities and challenges to democracy play out in different ways around the world, shaped by regional and country contexts. Beyond the diagnosis, and in order to help rebalance the current democracy debate, the report also provides policy considerations, building on the good practices and cases which have shown resilience in the face of challenges. International IDEA has collected these practices and cases during more than 20 years of regional and country-level technical assistance in democratic reform throughout the world.

The Report mainly targets policymakers and civil society organizations working at the national, regional or international levels, either implementing, supporting or advocating for democratic reforms. The report also targets those policymakers who may not be working directly on democratic reform but are involved in reform processes more broadly, be they economic, social or digital.

The global launch of the GSoD 2019 Report seeks to present the key findings of the report and discuss its policy relevance with policymakers from the international and bilateral donor community, national policymakers, civil society organizations and opinion-makers, to identify common solutions.

On 14 October 2019, the Foreign Affairs Council adopted new Council Conclusions on democracy under the Finnish Presidency of the Council of the European Union. The Conclusions call for a common and practical response from the EU and member states to the challenges to democracy in their actions worldwide. The analysis and data in the GSoD 2019 report provide an impartial, evidence-based backdrop for the EU's ongoing discussions on key priorities and actions to strengthen democracy worldwide. The Report's framework and indices enable a structural follow-up on the Council Conclusions and provide substantial input for the Panel Discussion organized by the Finnish EU Presidency immediately following the GSoD 2019 Global Launch.
